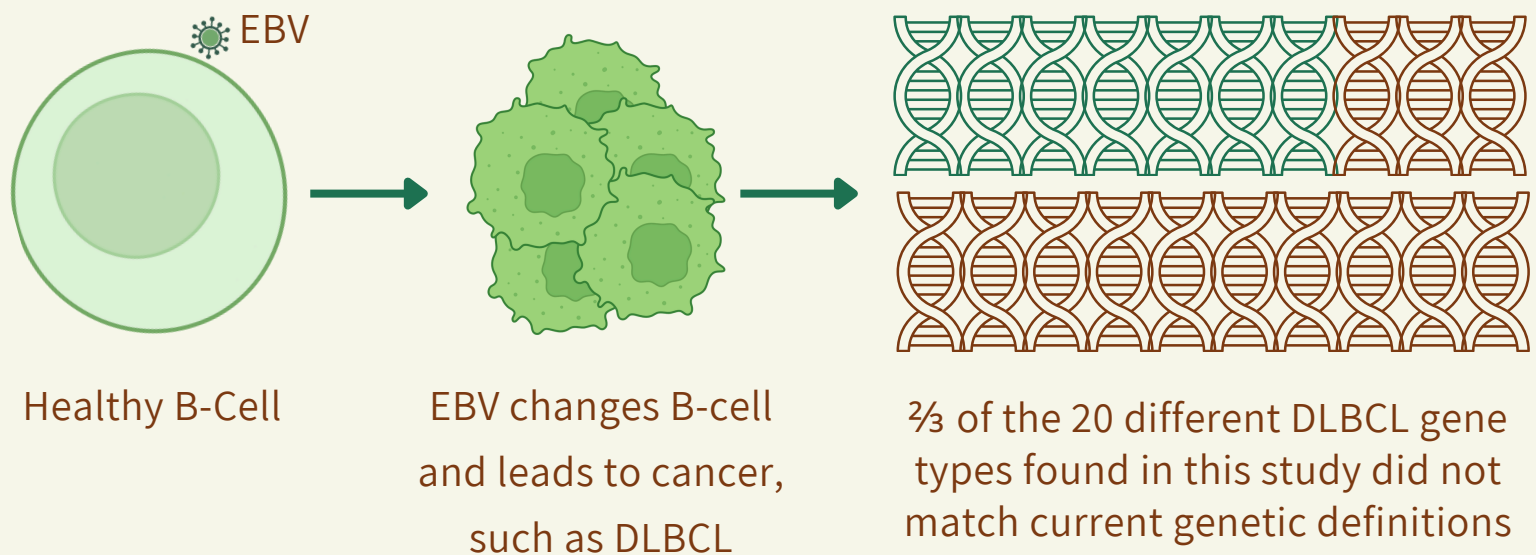


Epstein-Barr Virus and Lymphoma
